If you're birthing at a hospital or birth center: pack one small bag for labor, bringing only things which you find important for your and your support person(s)' comfort. Pack a separate bag for after the birth. The items below are only suggestions—feel free to leave out some items.

F	Snacks for you and labor support partner(s)
F	Personal comfort items (your own pillow, blanket, photos, stuffed animals, and so on)

	Phone or tablet with: camera, phone numbers of people to call after the birth, your choice of music (consider using the same playlist you have used for exercise, yoga or relaxation

For postpartum stay and bringing baby home:	
	Nightgown or pajamas that you can nurse in (you can also use a hospital gown)
	Robe and slippers (again, you can use the hospital's)

F	Brush or comb, whatever toiletries are important to you
	Nursing bra
	Clothes for the ride home (usually comfortable maternity clothes)
For your baby	
	Cloth diapers and waterproof diaper cover, or a few disposable diapers
	Undershirt or "onesie" (one-piece bodysuit)
	Nightgown or a simple one-piece footed outfit (don't worry about fancy clothes yet)
	Receiving blanket
	Warm blanket and cap (if needed for the ride home)
	Car seat (properly installed in your vehicle before labor)
